Parents can help their child develop a personal reading time each day during the summer. Students can be taught how to set a timer and read until the timer goes off. Please increase the time each day until your child is comfortable reading 20 minutes.

ARbookfinder.com is the website I use to determine Accelerated Reader points and the level of a book. You simply enter the title of the book, and you will receive the grade level of books and the number of AR points. Students could write down the titles of books they read along with the quiz number and be ready to take AR tests during the first days of school. This is not required.
